Action Planning to Drive Improved Reading Lessons

A half-day online course to raise reading standards. Research tells us a lot about what works in a reading classroom and signposts whole school initiatives that definitely raise standards.

This online course helps teachers to consider what skills need to be developed to support novice readers to become fluent and independent readers.

It shows schools how to:

- Prevent disfluency and help pupils to interpret and perform a text
- Support pupils to build their vocabulary banks so that they become more proficient readers
- Help pupils to make inferences by ensuring that they understand how texts work
- Incorporate close reading activities for fiction and non-fiction texts to improve comprehension
- Teach pupils to track a text and use visual representations of text to make meaning.
- Build the reading skills that lead to happy, independent readers.

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Closing the Achievement Gap in the New Curriculum

Huw Duggan

The Minister for Education and Skills has acknowledged that high quality CPD for teachers and teaching assistants can break the link between educational attainment and poverty. Research is unequivocal that classroom level approaches shown to be particularly effective at raising the attainment of children living in low-income households combine: quality literacy/oracy teaching, positive learning environments, peer tutoring; formative assessment and feedback; structured group work/cooperative learning; and meta-cognitive strategies as well as high levels of teacher commitment and resilience.

This one-day practical programme, led by Huw Duggan (Former strategic advisor for closing the gap), will focus on 'why' and 'how' to close the achievement gap in the classroom.

This course will consider:

- The imperatives of high aspirations and challenging learning culture
- The impact of effective curriculum design, experiential and purpose-based learning.
- Assessment IN Learning as means to accelerate pupil progress
- How to structure effective collaborative learning
- What high quality peer assessment looks like
- Examples of metacognitive strategies that can build pupils' self-esteem and Independence.

This course is for teachers, senior leaders and head teachers. Whilst this course has a focus on classroom practice and pedagogy, it should be considered in the light of the schools wider focus to develop a strategic approach to closing the gap.

Identifying ALN and interpreting behaviours

According to the School census Wales 2023... There were 10,485 pupils with Individual Development Plans under the new ALN system in maintained schools (16.6% of pupils with ALN or SEN), up from 3,330 (4.5%) at February 2022 <https://www.gov.wales/schools-census-results-headline-statistics-january-2023>

The requirement is clearly there –so how do we make sure we are addressing the needs of all our pupils?

Join us for a day of problem solving! We will discuss many behaviours and additional learning needs and how to effectively support pupils. This course will look at good practice in the mainstream classroom. You will learn about various strategies and ways to attune to your pupil's needs. You will have the opportunity to access observations made by specialist teaching. These will be presented as examples for you to take back to school and support pupils who may be struggling or identified as having ALN.

An important part of this system is accurate and relevant assessment of Additional Learning Needs of pupils already identified as needing extra support. It is also important to develop screening systems within the mainstream setting in order to recognise needs in pupils that might not be presenting their additional learning needs in an obvious way in class. A half-day online course to refresh the teaching of reading

To become effective readers pupils need to crack the phonic code and learn to make meaning independently. Pupils need explicit teaching to become effective readers and many daily opportunities to practise and apply their skills in live contexts. The 9 Reading Behaviours help pupils to learn what to do as they read. Initially, pupils learn each behaviour one-by-one, and overtime they learn to synthesise the behaviours, choosing the most useful strategies to unlock a text in any given context.

The 9 Reading Behaviours help pupils to solve problems as they read, engage with the text and to reflect on content.
